# **Daubert's Second Trip To Tallahassee**

Earlier this year, the Florida Supreme Court declined to adopt the *Daubert* standard to the extent it is procedural in nature. The Legislature amended Florida Statutes §90.702 and 90.704 to replace the *Frye* standard with *Daubert*. The Dicta of the Court's ruling called into question the constitutionality of the *Daubert* standard because the Court had "grave constitutional concerns"

as the Court feared the amendments to the admissibility of expert testimony would undermine the right to a jury trial and access to courts. The Court reserved ruling regarding the constitutionality of the provisions for the right case or controversy.

In July of this year, the Court accepted jurisdiction of a case by a 4-3 vote that will decide the fate of *Daubert*. *Richard Delisle v*. *Crane Co.*, *et. al.*, Case No. SC16-2182, involves a plaintiff who was diagnosed with mesothelioma from smoking Kent cigarettes containing asbestos in the filters and handling gaskets that contained asbestos. The Plaintiff won a large verdict after going to trial and the Defendants appealed the verdict challenging expert witness testimony offered by the Plaintiff's experts.

The Fourth DCA rendered their opinion before the Supreme Court

declined to adopt the changes to the evidence code. The Fourth DCA held that the amendments to the evidence code are presumed valid and therefore, the *Daubert* standard was applicable. The Fourth DCA went on to say that two of the three Plaintiff's experts should have been barred from testifying and reversed the jury's verdict.

A look at the *Delisle*'s on-line docket shows great interest in this case from various trade organizations. The Florida Justice Association and Concerned Physicians, Scientists and Scholars have filed amicus briefs for Delisle. The Florida Defense Lawyers Association, the Washington Legal Foundation, and the Florida Justice Reform Institute are seeking to file amicus briefs on behalf of the defendants.

I tend to believe that if it "ain't" broke don't fix it. It seems as though the reason *Daubert* was implemented in the first place was to weed out "junk" science. While this is a noble pursuit, there are other ways to accomplish that goal, such as allowing authoritative texts and treatises be introduced as substantive evidence, instead of just to impeach the expert witness. The Federal Rules of Evidence allow authoritative texts to be introduced as substantive evidence. A skilled, well prepared trial lawyer should be able effectively and persuasively convey to a jury of fair and impartial people, the absurdity of the "junk" science the expert witness is trying to peddle.







# Eye on 2018: Florida's Constitution Revision Commission

Article XI, Section 2 of the Florida Constitution establishes the Constitution Revision Commission ("CRC"). The CRC is comprised of a 37-member commission who assemble every 20 years for the purpose of reviewing and proposing amendments to the Florida Constitution. The 2017-2018 election year marks the third time the commission will convene following the enactment of the

1968 Florida Constitution. The commission consists of the Attorney General as well as members appointed by the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Senate President, and the Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court.

The two previous CRCs occurred in 1977 and 1997<sup>1</sup>. The 1977-1978 CRC referred eight proposals to the ballot for voter consideration. All eight proposals failed to pass the simple majority vote required for an amendment to be made. The last CRC convened in 1997-1998 and proposed nine amendments to the Florida Constitution. Florida voters passed eight of the proposed nine amendments. Examples of these amendments include: Amendment 5 (creating the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission); Amendment 6 (modifying Article IX to declare it "a paramount duty of the state" to provide education for children); and Amendment 7 (requiring that state revenue be used to fund the state court system and extending the terms of county judges). <sup>3</sup>

Currently, Florida is the only state in the country that provides voters the unique opportunity to review and revise their Constitution though the CRC. The CRC meets for approximately one year and travels throughout the state, listening to citizen comments and recommendations on potential amendments to the Constitution. Any amendments proposed by the CRC will be placed on the 2018 General Election Ballot. 60% voter approval is necessary for an amendment to pass. 4

Florida voters play a crucial role throughout this process, the most important of which will be voting on the proposals in November 2018. Additionally, voters had the opportunity to participate in public hearings and were allowed to submit proposed amendments to the



commission until October 6, 2017. <sup>5</sup> The CRC received more than 2,000 written proposals by the October 2017 deadline. This total does not include proposals received through email and those made during public comment at hearings. As of November 10, 2017, the CRC posted 103 proposals on its website. <sup>6</sup> Some examples of these are: establishing additional rights for victims of a crime; requiring circuit court review before a state attorney may pursue prosecution of a child as an adult in criminal court; requiring the Legislature to annually appropriate certain funds to be used toward postsecondary education financial assistance; and prohibiting the expenditure of public funds for campaign spending. The October deadline does not mark the end of public input as the panel intends to hold additional public hearings that have yet to be announced. The CRC is required to file the proposed amendments by May 10, 2018, 180 days before the general election on November 6, 2018. <sup>7</sup>

Florida is now the third largest state in the country. As its population continues to grow, it is important these revisions continue to reflect Florida's diverse culture. This year the CRC is considering amendments in areas such as: transportation, crime and justice, education reform, healthcare, and representation. Changing the Florida Constitution will have a lasting impact on this, and future generations. While the commissioners will ultimately decide what proposed changes go on the 2018 ballot, it is important to remember the power to change the Constitution resides solely with the voters.




