## Open House Party

#### THE PERILS OF HOSTING AN OPEN HOUSE PARTY

Common back to school scenario: Your teenager invites some friends to your home for a party after the Friday night football game. Being a responsible parent, you remain on the premises to supervise the party. Several of the party guests enter your home carrying "Big Gulps" from 7/11. The "Big Gulps" contain vodka which the teenage guests serve to other teenage guests. Two of the teens are involved in an alcohol-induced auto accident upon leaving the party. The accident causes personal injuries and property damage. Are you, as the parent of the teen hosting the party, civilly or criminally liable in this situation? Under Florida law, the answer depends upon whether the surrounding evidence shows that you had actual knowledge of the alcohol in the Big Gulp cups and failed to take reasonable steps to prevent possession or consumption of the alcohol by the underage party attendees once you had actual knowledge.

The controlling law in this situation is Florida's Open House Party Statute, §856.015 Fla. Stat. (2016) (hereinafter the "Statute"). A violation of the Statute occurs when an adult in control<sup>1</sup> of a residence where an open house party<sup>2</sup> is taking place knowingly allows possession or consumption of an alcoholic beverage (or controlled substance) and fails to take reasonable steps to prevent possession or consumption of same.<sup>3</sup> It is a first degree misdemeanor if the statutory violation is determined to be the cause of death or serious bodily injury.<sup>4</sup> Even when death or injury does not occur, a violator can be charged with a second degree misdemeanor.<sup>5</sup> A civil action for negligence per se may also be brought by an injured Plaintiff.<sup>6</sup> The highest hurdle a Plaintiff or prosecutor must clear in an action brought under the Statute is to prove the Defendant had ACTUAL knowledge of the possession or consumption of alcohol by underage individual(s).<sup>7</sup> Thus, in our Big Gulp hypothetical, the parent in control of the residence would have to be aware that the teens were holding and drinking vodka in their cups in order to be held civilly liable or criminally responsible. Even then, if the parent took reasonable steps to ensure that no further consumption or possession took place, he or she would be able to escape liability.<sup>9</sup> Although "reasonable steps" are not defined, the Florida Supreme Court has upheld this reasonableness standard as not being unconstitutionally vague.<sup>9</sup>

Very little caselaw currently exists to answer such questions as, what are the reasonable steps adults hosting open house parties must take to prevent underage consumption or possession? Are there scenarios in which actual knowledge is imputed due to circumstances? Are (or should) parents be required to conduct TSA-like security checks at the entrances of their homes when their teens invite friends over? Awareness of the law does not necessarily provide guidance how to adequately comply with its provisions. The issue bears watching for further developments.

## **President's Message**

This month we have two important things happening. First, at our September meeting we will vote on amendments to our Bylaws. And second, the program at that meeting will be devoted to a discussion of the proposed amendments to the Florida Constitution, which will be on the ballot for the November general election.

Bylaw Amendments. It has been several years since the last amendment to our Bylaws, and your Board

has noted several areas where the Bylaws do not address certain matters or do so in ways that seemed to us to not be in step with the current state of the local Bar. You will soon receive by email a redline copy of the Amended and Restated Bylaws proposed by the Board. Please be on the lookout for that email and review the proposal before the September meeting. It is not the purpose of this message to note every proposed change, some of which are minor or go to matters of drafting style, but I do want to comment on the more significant changes proposed. (1). Henceforth the President and President-Elect would be required to have both an office and residence in Manatee County. While we welcome members who do not meet those requirements, and those members may continue to be Directors and committee members, the Board felt that the President, as the face and primary representative of the local bar in the community, should have a strong connection to the community.



(2). The Law Library Committee is abolished as the Bar no longer has any responsibilities for the library. (3). Two new membership classes would be created. Associate Members would include active and retired attorneys, from Florida and other states, who do not qualify as Active Members. These members would be non-voting. This new class is one found in many other local bars. Law Student Affiliate Membership would be established, allowing students to participate in Bar functions. (4). The quorum for our meetings is lowered, in recognition of the fact that with increased membership, we sometimes fall short of a quorum under our current Bylaws. Your Board feels these amendments will be helpful and we ask for your support.

**Constitutional Revision Amendments.** Our speaker for the September meeting will be Carlos Beruff, the Chair of the Constitutional Revision Commission. The November election ballot will have eight proposed amendments to our Constitution. The current issue of the Florida Bar Journal has a summary and discussion of the amendments, which I encourage you to read before our meeting. As lawyers we have a greater ability and responsibility to understand the proposals, and to share our understanding and views with family, friends, clients and others who may look to us for guidance on how to vote. The meeting will give us a further opportunity to gain an understanding of the amendments proposed from Mr. Beruff, and to ask questions and discuss. I hope you will prepare and attend this important meeting.

## YLD News & Happenings **Election Season Frenzy Hits the Florida Supreme Court** By Gregory DeMeuse, Esq.

A major election is upcoming, which is hard to ignore. The airwaves are flooded bypolitical endorsements and candidates' signs line the main roadways running through town. Onething seems certain, change is on the horizon as new leaders contend for positions in our stateand federal government. In the executive branch, Florida's two-term governor, Rick Scott, willsoon be replaced, along

with his fellow Cabinet members Adam Putnam (Commissioner of Agriculture) and Pam Bondi (Attorney General). Rick Scott has turned his political ambitionsagainst longtime US Senator Bill Nelson, who has held public office for four and a half decades.Still, the most significant turnover could be in the judicial branch, where three members of theFlorida Supreme Court are due to retire in January 2019, on the last day of Rick Scott's term asGovernor.

During my final semester of law school, I had the honor of interning in the chambers of Justice Barbara J. Pariente, one of the justices facing mandatory retirement due to agelimitations. Justice Pariente has occupied a seat on the Florida Supreme Court since 1997. When combined with her two other colleagues soon to retire, Justice Peggy Quince and JusticeR. Fred Lewis, these three justices have a total tenure on our state's highest court of nearly sixtyyears. All three were also appointed during the second term of Lawton Chiles, the last Democratto be elected Governor of Florida. Interestingly though, Justice Quince's appointment wascompleted in unusual fashion, which foreshadowed a potential issue now arising with thereplacement of these three justices.

The crux of the problem is Article V, Section 8, of the Florida Constitution, containing the mandatory retirement age for justices and judges in the Florida judiciary. The provision states: "No justice or judge shall serve after attaining the age of seventy years except upontemporary assignment or to complete a term, one-half of which has been served." Accordingly, ajustice who turns seventy in the latter half of a term may complete that term, effectively retiring, and needing replacement, at the exact point in which the standing Governor's term ends as well.Back in 1998, to avoid conflict in whether the Governor elect rightfully gets to appoint thereplacement justice, Justice Quince was appointed via a joint agreement between lame duckGovernor Lawton Chiles and Governor elect Jeb Bush.

However, this time around, the end-of-term appointments will likely not occur assmoothly. In 2016, when Governor Scott appointed Justice Alan Lawson to the Florida SupremeCourt, the Governor laid claim to appointing three more justices on the final day of his term.But, depending on whom is elected as Scott's successor in the upcoming November election, hisclaim over the appointments may not go unchallenged. In fact, the forthcoming appointmentshave already been subject to legal challenge. In late 2017, the League of Women Voters of Florida brought a case before the Florida Supreme Court seeking to prohibit Governor Scott from"filling any judicial vacancies on Florida's appellate courts that

occur due to terms expiring inJanuary 2019." The court dismissed this action on the basis that relief would be premature, asthe Governor's anticipated exercise of the power of appointment may not ultimately occur.

Another twist in the saga comes from Florida's latest Constitution Review Commission. One of the Constitutional amendments submitted by the Commission on the ballot in November, Amendment 6, revises the mandatory retirement provision to increase the age to seventy-five andremove the ability of a judge or justice to serve the remainder of his or her term after reachingthis age limit. If Amendment 6 is approved by voters in the general election this year, the Amendment will take effect on July 1, 2019. Therefore, this unprecedented turnover on the Florida Supreme Court could be the last of its kind in Florida's history. All these factors add upto an unpredictable election season that will shape the future of the Florida Supreme Court fordecades to come.
