# DIVORCE Q&A FOR THE NON-DIVORCE-PRACTITIONER

As an attorney who practices almost exclusively in marital and family law, I am often approached in informal settings by laypersons and non-family lawyers who voice recurring family law questions. I hear many of these same questions over and over again:

Q: My husband bought me a BMW for our tenth anniversary. If we get divorced, don't I get to keep the car because it was a gift?

A: No. Florida Statutes Section 61.075(6)(a) defines "marital assets" to include "interspousal gifts during the marriage". Thus, while the court may allow the wife to retain her vehicle, the BMW will be "divided" as a marital asset, i.e., the husband will receive an asset of equal value.

Q: So all gifts are marital assets? That means my husband gets my engagement and wedding rings back?

A: No. It is a great blessing to family lawyers that these emotionally-charged and valuable items are usually a non-issue in divorce cases (assuming the rings were purchased prior to the marriage). Florida Statutes Section 61.075(6)(b) defines non-marital assets as those items "acquired by either party prior to the marriage". This would typically include engagement and wedding rings, which if unconditionally gifted become the property of the donee. See, e.g., Randall v. Randall, 56 So.3d 817 (2nd DCA 2011). Keep in mind that the rule regarding interspousal gifts during the marriage may apply in the rare case that an engagement or wedding ring is purchased after the marriage, or in cases where such rings are upgraded after the marriage.

Q: I owned a house for twenty years before I married my husband. When we refinanced the house last year, I put his name on the title, just so that it would feel like his house too. The house is still mine, right?

A: Probably not. Florida Statutes Section 61.075(6)(a)(2) provides that "all real property held by the parties as tenants by the entireties, whether acquired prior to or during the marriage, shall be presumed to be a marital asset". The retitling of the property is presumed to constitute a gift of a one-half interest in the property (continued on page 8)

# YLD News & Happenings Are Your Electronic Files Truly Protected?

On October 17, 2018, the Manatee County YLD hosted the Florida Bar YLD's Technology Roadshow CLE. The Manatee County Bar Association made their presence felt with the 2nd highest turnout for this CLE within the state so far. However, the CLE was a must for everyone. Whether you are a proud tech-wonk or a head nodder (someone that nods their head pretend-

ing to understand anytime technology is explained), everyone that attended learned valuable insights from the seminar.

One of the more eye-opening topics discussed, regarded securing electronic files. For example, you may be at risk if your law practice utilizes mobile devices, like cell phones, and you are of the mindset that there is limited exposure because of your limited use. In other words, even if you simply use your device to check emails, you may inadvertently open yourself up for a breach. We tend to forget these devices could be another exposure for our law firms if they are not properly protected. Specifically, you may be an easy target for a virtual "stick-up" for all your stored data in exchange for money. In case you were not aware, law firms are aggressively targeted these days with ransomware. Apparently, the bad guys have figured out that law firms are often vulnerable, especially if they store electronic data without proper protection to their access points or if they lack adequate backups.

Ransom malware or ransomware is a type of malicious software that prevents users from accessing their systems and files. The perpetrators then demand a ransom payment to restore the user's access. These cyber-thieves are the new "Jesse James", and like most criminals, they want a lot of money for something that requires little effort. Would-be hackers can easily purchase large amounts of email addresses illegally. Once the thieves obtain the email addresses, they cast their phishing lines out into the deep blue email sea – hoping to catch their shark.

How could this happen to me? Many of the ransomware culprits use social engineering to lure you into their trap. Often, the emails with infected attachments and malicious website links will appear to have originated from a trusted source, such as a friend, family member, business or even law enforcement.

Another popular method includes malicious advertising, known as malvertising. The culprits will run advertisements, even on legitimate websites, to lure in unsuspecting users. Sometimes this hijacking requires no effort or link clicking from the end user. Then after you are redirected to the criminal's server, they gather as much information as possible about you and your PC, tablet or phone. This helps them determine the best method of attack against you. Regardless of the method used, once infected, your computer will



start misbehaving because you have downloaded a sophisticated virus that will prevent you from accessing your device or any of your files unless you are willing to cough up money.

Sound far-fetched? According to Cisco, 49% of businesses reported at least one cyber-attack in 2016, of which 39% were ransomware attacks. The US alone recorded a 300% rise in ransomware attacks between 2015 to 2016. Furthermore, no one is immune. From small to large law firms; from government organizations to healthcare systems – everyone needs to be on their A-game. According to Cybersecurity Ventures, ransomware damages reached \$5 billion in 2017.

Anyway, there was a lot more to the Technology Roadshow than ransomware and there is a lot more to ransomware than what you just read. Hopefully, if you have not done so, you will make sure you have taken the necessary steps to protect your yourself in the digital era. from the one spouse to the other. The gift presumption can be overcome in rare cases, but requires clear and convincing evidence that a gift was not intended.

# Q: Now that I looked into it, I actually didn't put my husband's name on the title! Whoopee!...the house is all mine!!!

A: Not so fast. Especially if there existed a mortgage loan on the property at the time of the marriage, a fairly sophisticated analysis goes into determining the parties' non-marital and marital interests for purposes of equitable distribution of this asset (beyond the scope of this article).

#### Q: I make a lot of money and my husband doesn't work. If I hire a private detective to prove he's having an affair, I won't have to pay alimony, right?

A: Save your money on the private investigator. Although the alimony statute, Florida Statutes Section 61.08(1), still provides that "the court may consider the adultery of either spouse and the circumstances thereof in determining the amount of alimony, if any, to be awarded", this part of the statute has been largely eroded by case law. In Noah v. Noah, 491 So.2d 1124 (Fla. 1986), the Supreme Court found it difficult to reconcile that Florida is a "nofault" divorce state with the "vestige of fault" that remains in 61.08. And the many decisions that have followed over the years include holdings that "it is improper to refuse to award alimony or reduce the amount of alimony merely because of the existence of evidence of the requesting spouse's adultery" (Phillips v. Phillips, 504 So.2d 412 (Fla. 4th DCA 1987)), and that "absent a showing of a related depletion of marital assets, a party's adulterous misconduct is not a valid reason to award a greater share of those marital assets to the innocent spouse or to deny the adulterous spouse alimony". Childers v. Childers, 640 So.2d 108 (4th DCA 1994). In my experience, absent relevance to a particular custody issue and absent an "adulterous depletion of marital assets", most judges are not inclined to hear any testimony regarding adultery.

#### Q: Is Manatee County a 50/50 custody county?

A: It sounds like such an awkward question, doesn't it? But I've heard it phrased exactly that way many times. I interpret the question to mean, "Is it the law in Florida that Manatee County judges must follow a presumption in favor of an equal custody (by statute called "timesharing") schedule?" Florida Statutes Section 61.13(2)(c)(1) states that "there is no presumption for or against any specific timesharing schedule". However, while there is no such presumption, "it is the public policy of this state that each minor child has frequent and continuing contact with both parents...and to encourage parents to share the rights, responsibilities, and joys of childrearing". Id. While I would not venture a guess on the statistics, suffice it to say that equal overnight, or "50/50", timesharing schedules are very common these days. That said, the Section 61.13 timesharing factors to be considered by judges sometimes do not sway the court toward awarding equal timesharing. Factoring into a judge's decision could be something so extreme as one parent having a difficult drug or alcohol problem, to something more innocuous, such as one parent having an erratic work schedule whereby regular overnight timesharing is simply impractical. Ultimately, the judges in this and every other county in Florida are challenged with weighing the twenty factors in Section 61.13 to devise a timesharing schedule that strives for the ideal of "frequent and continuing contact" while focusing on the child(ren)'s overall best interests. The notion that there exists any "50/50 county" or "50/50 judge" in Florida ignores

#### the gravity and unique complexities of custody decisions.

Q: My husband has been acting very unusual lately. He's been drinking more than usual, and frequently yells at me the kids. He's moved out, but anymore I just don't know what he might be capable of. Can't I get a restraining order against him?

A: Based on these limited facts, probably not. A restraining order (better known to criminal and family lawyers as an "injunction for protection against domestic violence") is a civil remedy which judges do not take lightly, as it significantly limits many freedoms and liberties of the non-movant, can create employment problems for them, etc. The party seeking an injunction must demonstrate to the court that he or she is either the victim of domestic violence (as defined by Section 741.28, Florida Statutes) or has reasonable cause to believe he or she is in imminent danger of becoming a victim of domestic violence. See Florida Statutes Section 741.30(6) (a). "Where fear alone is the 'reasonable cause' alleged to support injunction for protection against domestic violence, then not only must the danger feared be imminent, but the rationale for the fear must be objectively reasonable as well". Zapiola v. Kordecki, 210 So.3d 249 (Fla. 2nd DCA 2017). In other words, speculation regarding what someone demonstrating erratic behavior "might do next" will rarely cut it.
