N.O.T.I.C.E Regarding Book/Page Numbers in the Manatee County Clerk's Official Records

Beginning January 1, 2020, the Manatee County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller will no longer assign Book and Page numbers to documents recorded in Official Records. The Clerk will continue assigning consecutive Instrument Numbers as the official register numbers to reflect the order in which documents have been recorded. For historical purposes, documents recorded prior to January 1, 2020, will remain indexed and searchable by Book and Page. If you create or use forms that reference Book and Page numbers, you should modify those forms to capture or reference Instrument Numbers for any documents recorded on or after January 1, 2020. Recorded plat maps will continue to receive Book and Page numbers.



Legal Challenges in the Wake of New Florida Hemp Law

As many of you know, Florida Senate Bill 1020, also known as the "Hemp Law," went into effect on July 1, 2019. As a result, hemp is now legal to use and have in your possession. The bill defines hemp as "the plant *Cannabis sativa L*. and any part of that plant, including the seeds thereof, and all derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, 2 isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers thereof, whether growing or not, that has a total delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration that does not exceed 0.3 percent on a dry-weight basis." See Florida Statute §581.217(3)(d).

The new law modified the definition of cannabis, excluding hemp, as defined in section 581.217. However, this modification has created new challenges for law enforcement conducting cannabis-based stops and arrests, and

for state attorneys seeking convictions. These challenges start with the fact that hemp and cannabis both come from the same plant, so they look, feel and smell the same. The main difference between hemp and cannabis is that hemp has a total delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) concentration that does not exceed 0.3%. Therefore, if the THC concentration of the plant is less than or equal to 0.3%, then the plant is hemp, and is legal, but if the THC concentration of the plant exceeds 0.3%, then the plant is cannabis and is illegal (exclusions for medicinal purposes).

Prior to this law being enacted, law enforcement could conduct warrantless cannabis-based searches based on odor or plain view from a vehicle or person. This was an exception to the Fourth Amendment warrant requirement. Now, in the wake of legalizing hemp, it does not seem economically wise to do so. Why? Mainly because any good defense attorney will file a motion to suppress and challenge how the officer could have known what the substance was at the time of the alleged offense. K-9 dogs are unable to make this distinction either. Therefore, if hemp and cannabis are not distinguishable to the naked eye/ nose - how could an officer differentiate in order to justify a detention on an individual or vehicle?

Typically, law enforcement would use presumptive field tests to corroborate their suspicion. To date, Florida law enforcement agencies field tests do not distinguish THC levels. Furthermore, quantitative testing via a laboratory instrument is required to prove what a substance is beyond a reasonable doubt. Currently, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement laboratories cannot determine THC levels. So, this presents a challenge for prosecutors with a significant caseload and a budget. Although, law enforcement agencies are working quickly to meet these challenges and obtain affordable, reliable, *Daubert*-proof testing kits that will hold up in court.

The legalization of hemp does not mean Florida drug traffickers will waltz in and out of court though. There are "odor plus" factors that law enforcement will utilize to make probable cause arrests based on the totality of the circumstances standard. Factors that indicate the substance is cannabis and not its THC-deficient cousin, hemp. For example, factors such as nervousness, conflicting statements, furtive movements, signs of impairment, quantity, offender's background, guns, wads of cash, etc., may indicate that the illicit nature of the substance. And if the case is significant enough, there are laboratories available for quantitative testing.

For now, there are state attorney offices throughout Florida that have determined there will be no formal filing of charges unless there are lab results proving beyond a reasonable doubt that the substance contains THC above the 0.3 % threshold. Constitutional speedy trial concerns will also add pressure, in addition to costs, and likely force state attorney offices to prioritize on felony cannabis cases. Some law enforcement agencies are not throwing in the towel just yet and have vowed to remain creative. Thus, this area of the law will likely remain a source of spirited debate and litigation.

2020 Judicial Nominating Commission Nominations To Be Made

Judicial Nominating Commissions: One lawyer vacancy for each of the 26 JNCs. The Florida Bar has the opportunity to nominate three lawyers for each JNC to Gov. Ron DeSantis for his appointment. Each appointee will serve a four-year term, commencing July 1,2020. Applicants must be members of The Florida Bar engaged in the practice of law and a resident of the territorial jurisdiction served by the commission to which the member is applying. Commissioners are not eligible for state judicial office for vacancies filled by the JNC on which they sit for 2 years following completion of their term.

Persons interested in applying for these vacancies may download the JNC application from The Florida Bar's website, or should call Bar headquarters at (850) 561-5757, to obtain the application form. Completed applications must be received by the executive director, The Florida Bar, 651 East Jefferson Street, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-2300 or submitted via e-mail to jncform@flabar. org no later than 5:30 p.m on Monday, December 16. Resumes will not be accepted in lieu of the required application. The Board of Governors will review all applications and may request telephone or personal interviews.
