Electronic Wills for Florida!

I really didn't believe it would ever happen, but it has. The Florida Legislature has passed, and the Governor has signed, House Bill 409 into law, effective June 7, 2019. Under this law, a person can create and execute an Electronic Will. Under Fla. Stat. §732.521, an "Electronic Will" means a testamentary instrument, including a codicil, executed with an electronic signature by a person in the manner prescribed by this code, which disposes of the person's property on or after his or her death and includes an instrument which merely appoints a personal representative or guardian or revokes or revises another Will. An "Electronic signature" means an electronic mark visibly manifested in a record as a signature and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.

As estate planning practitioners, traditionally, the testator/testratix, the witnesses and the notary are all in the same room and witnessing everyone signing the Will. With this new law, this requirement is satisfied by the testator, the witnesses and the online notary being present and electronically signing by means of audio-video communication technology.

In addition, House Bill 409 made amendments to the Florida Power of Attorney Act as they relate to the "super powers". Essentially a principal (one who creates the Durable Power of Attorney document) cannot execute super powers in his or her document if the document is witnessed remotely. Further, a vulnerable adult cannot create their Durable Power of Attorney document through audio-communication technology.

For a practitioner to be effective in their advocacy for their clients and protection of their practice, one must become very familiar with the new law as well as the required audio-communication technology procedures. There is an elaborate process set forth in detail in Fla. Stat. Section 117, so please be sure to familiarize yourself with online notarization, recording requirements, electronic journaling, witnessing, security and storage of the electronic documents by qualified custodians. The world of legal technological advancements has become a reality and we are moving onward and upward!
