

Michael graduated from Manatee High School in 1993 and was part of the 1992 State Championship football team. He proudly graduated from Florida State University with a Bachelor of Science Degree, and he received his Juris Doctorate in 2001 from the Nova Southeastern University Shepard Broad Law Center.

Michael was a loving and giving person and will be truly missed by his family, friends, colleagues, clients, and the legal community. He is survived by his beloved mother, sister, brothers, nephews, and nieces.



Attorney dreams of camp for ill children

While hospitalized, Eddie Mulock was touched by the children with a variety of ills.

Two years ago Bradenton attorney Eddie Mulock was a patient at Shands Hospital in Gainesville where he underwent a life-saving heart transplant.

While he was there, Mulock was touched by the children he saw who so bravely endured a variety of ills. It was then he began to think about ways to make life more enjoyable for children like those who were undergoing chemotherapy and other medical procedures.

From those first mental musings grew the Foundation for Dreams, a not-for-profit organization Mulock formed after his recovery. The goal of the foundation is to raise money to create a wilderness camp where children suffering from disease and illness can enjoy the great outdoors.

"There are plenty of these kids out there who could benefit from some simple fun that their parents can't always provide," foundation director Cindy Cablish said. "We want this to be something special for them."

Now the camp is on the verge of becoming a reality. Mulock, Cablish and director of development Joleen Roskamp spent the past year developing budgets and program plans for the camp.

Cablish visited several existing camps for children with special needs and built a network of connections with children's groups, which could ultimately benefit from the endeavor.

Foremost on the foundation's list of goals for the coming year is location of a suitable site for the camp. Founders want at least 20 usable acres in eastern Manatee County surrounded by woods or wetlands. They hope someone will step forward to donate property.

Next comes the daunting task of raising the \$400,000 needed to get the camp up and running. The foundation also is looking for a major corporate sponsor.

Mulock said the camp will be re-

gional, serving children from at least 10 counties. Those suffering from cancer, cerebral palsy, or faced with other physical or mental challenges will be among those

invited to participate in camp ac-

They named the camp SWAMP Critters, to evoke a special southern, Florida feel. SWAMP took on new meaning and now stands for "Special Wishes And Magical Play.

Mulock and Cablish envision the camp evolving in three phases.

They hope the camp will begin accepting children for day activities and afternoon therapy programs by summer 1998.

The day programs would operate Tuesdays through Saturdays year-round. Later, the camp would add weekend camp sessions for children with chronic or debilitating illness.

"If we ask people for help, we want them to see a facility that is used all the time," Cablish said.

The camp would offer a range of traditional camp activities plus a variety of therapy programs involving animals, including an equestrian riding therapy program.

Cablish said many existing community organizations stepped forward to offer assistance in providing services and programs at the camp.

"The response from the community has just been overwhelming," Cablish said. "We see this as a facility where all these groups and agencies can connect."

On Oct. 8 the foundation will host the first of many fund-raisers planned for the coming year. That evening the foundation will host a \$100 a plate cigar and wine-tasting at the Sandbar restaurant in Anna Maria.

In the meantime, Mulock keeps a steady eye on his dream:

"My dream is to go out there and just see these little kids riding a horse or sitting around a campfire and really enjoying themselves," he said.
