

Post Tragedies: A Chance to Help

Hurricanes are an unfortunate reality of living in Florida. Ian has left in its wake devastation and tragedy on a scale not seen along Southwest Florida's coast in more than a decade. Manatee County was spared a direct hit from Ian, which, undoubtably, saved local homes, businesses, and lives. Whether you attribute Ian's shift in course away from Manatee County to good luck, a higher power, or native American legends, the result was the same; Manatee County suffered minimal impact while our southerly neighbors paid dearly for our good fortune.



Unfortunately, a small subset of individuals see a financial opportunity to be reaped from tragedy. Some may intentionally engage in price gouging to try to make a profit off the suffering of others. Some others may unintentionally engage in price gouging as they seek to offset what may be their own increased cost of doing business after the storm. While still others may see this as an opportunity to extort honest businesses through threats of false price gouging claims. As lawyers, we owe our community and clients an understanding of what is, and what is not, permissible in relation to price changes after an emergency has been declared so that we can help safeguard our community and clients from harmful predatory or ignorant behavior.

Price gouging is controlled under Florida Statute 501.160 which kicks into effect during a declared state of emergency. This stat-



ute makes it unlawful to rent, sell, lease, offer to rent, sell, or lease essential commodities, dwelling units, or self-storage facilities at an unconscionable price. There is a presumption that a price is unconscionable if: there is a gross disparity between the price charged during the state of emergency and the average price during the 30 days before the state or emergency, or the price grossly exceeds the average price the same or similar commodity was available in the area during the 30 days before the declaration of the state of emergency. The statute takes

into account effects of increased costs and market trends, which seems important in light of today's high inflationary environment.

The statute covers lodging and storage facilities, and essential commodities necessary for use or consumption as a direct result of the emergency. A "commodity" means any good, service, material, merchandise, supplies, equipment, resources, or other article of commerce, and includes, without limitation, food, water, ice, chemicals, petroleum products, and lumber. Commodities covered under the statute include those rented, sold or offered for rent or sale within the area of the declared state of emergency and necessary for consumption or use as a direct result of the emergency. The law also requires those selling goods and services to possess a business tax receipt. There are some real teeth behind this statute as it may result in hefty fines, as well as giving rise to claims under the Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act, which itself, has its own harsh set of penalties, including the potential for treble damages and attorneys' fees.

With the foregoing knowledge, we may be able to help guide our business minded clients into staying on the ethical side of sales after a tragedy has occurred. We may be able to help protect our business clients from fraudulent or extortionary threats of false price gouging complaints. And, we may be able to help our community by identifying and reporting instances of genuine and intentional price gouging. Through these steps, we may be able to help our community and those to our south recover from this tragedy by minimizing the additional harm that they may otherwise suffer as a result of bad business practices and predatory behavior.




Hurricane Ian: A look at the Stats



As this article is being written, many residents of southwest Florida are still reeling from the effects of Hurricane Ian, which made landfall just last week. After first raging over Cuba, Hurricane Ian blasted southwest Florida, arriving as a Category 4 Hurricane. Ian arrived over Cayo Costa, Florida with over 150 mph winds, making it the fifth strongest hurricane on record within the United States. Several courthouses across Florida had to close, including ours within the 12th Judicial Circuit. Both the MCJC and the Lynn Silvertooth Courthouses closed during the week of the hurricane, reopening on Monday, October 3rd; however, those in south county were delayed. The areas of Fort Myers, Sanibel/Captiva, Naples, and Cape Coral took the brunt of the storm, and it is estimated that it will be several weeks, perhaps even months for power to be restored in some areas. According to the Washington Post, when looking at Ian by the numbers, we can see what makes Hurricane Ian one of the worst in our recorded history:

By the Numbers:

- *150 mph, the winds of Ian ties for fifth highest with seven other storms
- *12' plus storm surge, with possibilities of up to 18' in some areas
- *Union Park, FL recorded 21.6" of rain in 36 hours, a "one in 500" year rainfall
- *Appx. 1,000 lightning strikes were recorded just inside the eyewall before making landfall
- *Appx. 34,000 lightning strikes were recorded in the storm total
- *Appx. \$60 Billion in private insured losses are estimated
- *2.7 million people lost power in Florida
- *2.5 million evacuated by order
- *6000 flights were cancelled
- *72 Floridians perished at the time of this article, with three in Manatee County and four in Sarasota County according to Fox Weather.
- *Search and Rescue efforts are still ongoing



Bradley E. Smith, CDR, United States Navy, Ret.

Assigned to Attack Squadron VA-76 in February 1965, flying off the Aircraft Carriers USS Roosevelt, America, and Enterprise. Smith began flying combat missions in the A-4 Skyhawk in November 1965. He was forced to eject over North Vietnam while flying his 77th combat mission on March 25, 1966. The North Vietnamese captured LT Smith and held him as a Prisoner of War for the next 2,516 days, until his release during Operation Homecoming on February 12, 1973.

His 2nd Silver Star Citation reads:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity while interned as a Prisoner of War in North Vietnam. In October 1966, his captors, completely ignoring international agreements, subjected him to extreme mental and physical cruelties in an attempt to obtain military information and false confessions for propaganda purposes. Through his resistance to those brutalities, he contributed significantly toward the eventual abandonment of harsh treatment by the North Vietnamese, which was attracting international attention. By his determination, courage, resourcefulness, and devotion to duty, he reflected great credit upon himself and upheld the highest traditions of the Naval Service and the United States Armed Forces.

Twelfth Circuit Judicial Center Identification Cards (JCID cards)

On August 26, 2022, Chief Judge Charles Roberts issued Administrative Order 2022-10.2, *In Re: Security and Operations of Court Facilities*. Pursuant to this new administrative order, when feasible and practical during times of high volume, judicial security at the Manatee County Judicial Center and the Silvertooth Judicial Center will open dedicated, expedited screening lines for attorneys displaying a current JCID card. The JCID card is valid at both locations and the dedicated lines are expected to begin on October 10, 2022.

How the JCID card works

During peak times and upon presentation of a current JCID card, attorneys will go through their own screening line without the requirement of removing shoes or belts. All items in your care, control or possession must also be screened by security. If you forget your card, you may be denied expedited screening and/or redirected to the public screening line.

Attorneys can visit the JCID application page on the Court's website from October 1 through November 30 each year to apply for a JCID card. Attorneys must renew their JCID application each year during this timeframe to be eligible for continued access to the expedited screening line. Please note that the application period is only open during the months of October and November – if you miss it, you cannot apply again until next October. The application includes consent to a criminal background check.

The application fee is \$25; the fee for a replacement JCID card is \$10; both fees must be paid by credit card online. The application fee is waived for government* attorneys; replacement card fees will not be waived.






