"Z Words" and Their Place in The Florida Rules of Professional Conduct

Within the Preamble of Chapter 4 of the Rules of Professional Conduct and the Comment to Rule 4-1.3 (concerning diligence), the words zeal, zealous, and zealously are used

to describe the way a lawyer advocates and pursues justice for clients. These "Z words," and their inclusion in our governing rules, were at the center of discussion for a Subcommittee of the Real Property, Probate and Trust Law Section ("RPPTL") Professionalism & Ethics Committee. The Subcommittee was formed in April 2022 to determine whether these Z words should be removed and replaced as there are instances where attorneys have relied on these terms to shield and/or exculpate the use of unprofessional behavior.

In reaching their recommendation, the Subcommittee chose four areas of research and review, including the definition and etymology of the Z words, the history of these terms withing the Florida Bar Rules of Professional Conduct, the interpretation of the Z words by Courts as shown in Florida case law, and whether Z words are included in other state jurisdiction rules of professional conduct.

The Subcommittee determined that "the contemporary, plain language use of and reference to the Z-terms are often associated with negative extremist behavior and character. Use of the Z-terms in the Florida Bar Professional Rules of Conduct has a parallel negative course as well. The Subcommittee determined these findings to be manifested in a significant body of Florida case law, with cases as recent as 2022, wherein there are several examples of attempts to justify unprofessional behavior. The Subcommittee concluded that the Z-terms in the Rules causes confusion and encourages or otherwise shields unprofessional behavior. Other state jurisdictions that have examined and removed the Z-terms from their professional rules of conduct consistently cite similar negative opinions regarding the Z-terms." Therefore, the Subcommittee recommended, and the Professionalism and Ethics Committee of the RPPTL Section unanimously voted, that the Z words should be removed from The Florida Bar Rules of Professional Conduct, Chapter 4 Preamble, and Rule 4-1.3 Comment and replaced with proposed language drafted by the Subcommittee.

In support of their recommendation, the Subcommittee cited to a plethora of Florida case law, including *The Florida Bar v.*

Buckle, 771 SO. 2d 1131 (Fla. 2000) in which the Court held that a lawyer's obligation of zealous representation should not and cannot be transformed into a vehicle intent upon harassment and intimidation. Moreover, the Court found that "we must never permit a cloak of purported zealous advocacy to conceal unethical behavior." *Id*.

The Subcommittee's proposed language, in part, is as follows (strikethrough for removed language, underline for added language):

Chapter 4. Preamble - As an advocate, a lawyer zealously asserts the client's position with commitment and dedication to the interest of the client under the rules of the adversary system.

Zealous Commitment and dedication in advocacy is are not inconsistent with justice.


Comment to Rule 4-1.3 Diligence – A lawyer must also act with commitment and dedication to the interests of the client and with zeal in advocacy upon the client's behalf.

These proposed changes were read to the RPPTL Executive Council for informational purposes and are set to be voted on for approval at the next Board of Governors meeting in May. Representing the Traumatized Client

Does this sound familiar? You have a client that never calls you back, does not do what you ask, is constantly on edge when speaking with you, insists on controlling the conversation, and second guesses everything you say.

Before you identify this client as "difficult," dreading each phone call or interaction with them, consider whether the traumatic event that brought the client to you is affecting their behavior.

Every lawyer has likely interacted with a traumatized client more often than they think, especially in legal fields prone to cases stemming from traumatic events like a car crash, domestic abuse, sexual assault, or military service. Clients also may be dealing with traumatic events from their past that they have not completely resolved, or worse yet, a compounding of prior trauma with the events that brought them to your office.

Identifying symptoms of trauma in a client is crucial for your relationship with your client, but also to protect the mental health of the lawyer and their staff. The following are a few common symptoms attorneys may regularly see in their clients.

The first is memory alteration.¹ Based on the biology of how the brain recalls a traumatic event, memories are not stored as a linear story, but instead in fragments. Over the course of time, as the person tells the story multiple times, new insights will emerge and the story will change. This can pose a huge challenge when a client is required to testify at different stages of the legal proceedings. Clients' face attacks for a story that changes and get called an inaccurate historian, causing issues for the case. Instead of writing off the case, consider using a mental health expert to explain to opposing counsel or to a jury how the brain stores traumatic memory.

Next is <u>behavior avoidance</u>.² Lawyers often ask, "Why did this person hire a lawyer if they're not going to do what I ask?" Lawyers must understand that traumatized clients will avoid activities, people, and places associated with the trauma they sustained. Avoidance behavior explains many of the issues lawyers run into with "difficult" clients such as clients not returning phone calls, not turning in discovery answers on time, or being less than thrilled to attend events related to the case. They're trying to avoid re-traumatization!

The last symptoms is an <u>exaggerated startle response</u>, <u>agitation</u>, <u>hyperarousal and reactivity</u>.³ Some clients appear to constantly be on edge, angry, or quick to argue or question your decision

making, in an effort to deal with the trauma they experienced and to prevent future traumas, clients will be hypervigilant, and the more aware of this an attorney (and their staff) can be, the more the attorney can alter the way they interact and react to the client. A little forethought can make a huge impact on client comfort.

A term that is being used across the United States, and beyond, is "trauma-informed legal practice." This term has evolved from other helping professions, education, medical, and dental practices. It stems from the growing awareness that any client can seek assistance in your practice, and the likelihood of that individual having experienced a trauma is beyond chance. It supposes that legal practitioners should assume that new clients have experienced trauma of some kind and will have a high likelihood of being overwhelmed by the legal process.

From this perspective, attorneys no longer change their procedures for carrying out a case for a traumatized client. They define a set of trauma-informed practices that are appropriate for all clients, and that meet the specific needs of those clients experiencing significant trauma related symptoms (see above).

When developing new "Trauma-Informed Procedures" it is important to remember that a law firm can be unfamiliar territory for all clients. It can be especially unfamiliar for a client who is attempting to regulate their emotions after dealing with a trauma. Further, they're coming to discuss a difficult situation they've experienced. Prior to interacting with the client, whether by phone or in person, attorneys should stay present and mindful of the client's situation during the conversation. Be aware that hypervigilance is a defense mechanism the client uses because of an impaired sense of safety.⁴

This sounds simple, but if a hypervigilant client has called for the third time this week and the attorney is juggling multiple responsibilities, mindfulness can quickly go out the window. For that reason, ensure you have enough time to communicate with the client fully and thoroughly. Stay patient in knowing you need to walk the client through the process. The more comfortable they are with you, the more effective your representation will be.

In preparing the client for adversarial events in the case, such as a deposition or a defense medical examination, plan to prepare the client thoroughly. Set the scene of the event: Who will be there? How long will it last? What will it entail? What type of questions will be asked? And what should they do if they feel themselves becoming anxious or angry. The more prepared you can make a client, hopefully, the more comfortable they will be during the event.

Representing clients who elicit trauma symptoms can be draining. In an effort to avoid burnout, which can prevent a reasonable attorney from practicing patience and empathy, attorneys and their staff need to practice self-care. Compassion Fatigue is the name given to a lawyer's growing exhaustion and disillusionment, during times of burnout and client related stress. 





Manatee Clerk of Court Announces 2023 Operation Green Light Event dates to Help Customers Save on Fees to Reinstate Driver Licenses

March 1, 2023

The Office of Angelina "Angel" Colonneso, Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller for Manatee County is hosting its annual Operation Green Light event for two Saturdays in March. This in person event will take place on Saturday, March 11, 2023 and Saturday, March 25, 2023 from 8:30 a.m. to noon.

Since 2016, beginning with Driver License Reinstatement Days, the Clerk's office has helped hundreds of customers become eligible for driver license reinstatement.

"Operation Green Light is not just about getting your license back, it's about taking control of your future," said Angel Colonneso, Clerk of the Circuit Court & Comptroller for Manatee County. "With a valid driver's license, you have more time, more freedom, and more opportunity. Which is why we are proud to host this event every year. I encourage people to take advantage of this event to get back on the road again."

Event Details

This upcoming event is an opportunity for Manatee County customers with suspended driver licenses to pay overdue court obligations, including traffic tickets, while saving up to 30 percent in collection agency fees.

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)'s FLOW bus will be on-site offering license reinstatement assistance.

What Customers Need to Know

For customers interested in setting up a payment plan, pursuant to F.S. 28.246 a down payment of up to \$100 is required, in addition to a \$25 charge to establish a payment plan, plus any clearance fees.

Only customers who did not participate in the 2022 Operation Green Light event are eligible to participate this year.

Customers need to bring with them their driver license and case numbers, if they have it, and cash or a credit card for payment. A 3.5% non-refundable processing fee will be added to each credit card transaction.

This is a walk-in event and appointments are not required.
