The MCBA Assists the SELAH Freedom Project

The MCBA Young Lawyer Division recently won the "Best Community Service Project" at this year's Florida Bar Affiliate Outreach Conference for their

upcoming money drive for the local organization, SELAH Freedom. The drive hopes to raise much needed money for the YLD to purchase items on SELAH Freedom's Amazon Registry and provide baskets for the women in their residential program.

SELAH Freedom is a multi-faceted anti-human trafficking nonprofit organization located in Chicago and Sarasota. Their goal is to bring awareness to prevent sex trafficking and assist those that have been saved from the industry. SELAH Freedom does this through different programs: awareness, prevention, outreach, residential, and consulting.

According to their website, <u>www.selahfreedom.com</u>, 6,853 survivors have been served, 72,728 kids and adults have been trained, and have reached over 2 billion through media. SELAH Freedom combats trafficking by bringing awareness to the community by training adults on what trafficking could look like, and training children about how recruiting might occur and from whom.

The statistics in our own backyard are staggering. Sex trafficking is estimated to be a \$99 billion dollar industry, and 2 million children are sold each year. Traffickers can make up to \$1.6 million per victim, the average age ranging from 15-17 years old. Unfortunately, Florida ranks in the top 3 states for trafficking.

In addition to bringing awareness, training, and consulting to the community, SELAH Freedom also has a residential program for young women saved from trafficking. This house allows the women to re-acclimate back into society at their pace, while also protecting them in the process.

SELAH Freedom's website has an Amazon Registry full of essential items that keep this residence running. The list includes clothes, cleaning supplies, deodorant, paper towels, and much more. The link to the registry will be included at the bottom of this article.

One of the important purposes of the MCBA YLD is to empower lawyers to promote the wellbeing of the community at large. This organization is combating an invasive and devastating industry right in our community, and they deserve to be supported.

The YLD's drive will raise money for two purposes. The first is to encourage firms and MCBA members to make monetary donations or gift donations from the gift registry in order to stock the house with these essential items. The second is to raise money to buy each of the current residents a basket full of personable items to make their stay as comfortable as possible. The basket includes a plush pillow, a blanket, hair clips, pens, a notebook, headphones, and more.

Once the drive is completed, the MCBA YLD will present SELAH Freedom with the gift baskets and encourage the organization to keep fighting for our community. An e-mail with details about the date of the drive will go out to all members by e-mail, and the MCBA YLD encourages the MCBA, as a whole, to show support for this amazing organization.



RESCISSION OF MEDIATED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS FOR DISCOVERY VIOLATIONS

Florida law has always favored the settlement of disputes. In the context of a mediation, Florida courts have also found grounds to set aside settlement agreements for various reasons. For example, in *Vitakis-Valchine v. Valchine*, 793 So.2d 1094 (Fla. 4th DCA 2001), the Fourth District Court of Appeal held that misconduct by a mediator in violation of the Florida Rules for Certified and Court Appointed Mediators can provide a basis for setting aside a mediated settlement agreement.

The Fourth District Court of Appeal recently held that in a case where one party withheld material information and discovery from the other party, a mediated settlement agreement can be rescinded. In *Garvin v. Tidwell*, 126 So.3d 1224 (Fla. 4th DCA 2012), Mrs. Garvin sued Mrs. Tidwell for injuries suffered as a result of a fall from a horse named Buster owned by Mrs. Tidwell. Prior to riding Buster, Mrs. Garvin inquired several times as to whether the horse had ever exhibited any dangerous behavior. Mrs. Tidwell advised Mrs. Garvin that the horse did not have any problems. However, on Mrs. Garvin's third ride, Buster reared up, bolted off at a fast gallop and then stopped suddenly to change direction. As a result, Mrs. Garvin fell off the horse and was injured.

Mrs. Garvin filed a complaint and alleged that Buster had a long and well known history of bucking and running away, and that Mrs. Tidwell negligently failed to disclose the horse's dangerous propensities.

Mrs. Garvin sent interrogatories and a production request to Mrs. Tidwell for information and documents concerning the care, maintenance, and training of Buster, including feeding, medical issues and riding. Mrs. Tidwell responded to the interrogatories and production request. Mrs. Tidwell testified at her deposition that Buster had no tendency for dangerous behavior and was a gentleman who was lazy, if anything.

The parties went to mediation and settled in the fall of 2010. Mrs. Garvin's attorney then received an unmarked envelope containing a magazine advertisement for a dietary supplement for horses dated "Spring 2010". The advertisement featured a page about a horse-calming supplement known as "Ex-Stress". The featured horse was Buster. Mrs. Tidwell was quoted as saying that she decided to give Ex-Stress to her horse because the horse could be a little difficult at times and that it made a huge difference in his behavior.

Mrs. Tidwell and her attorney had not produced the advertisement in response to discovery. Mrs. Garvin moved to reopen discovery, rescind the settlement agreement and for sanctions. The trial court denied the motion to rescind the agreement and for sanctions, and Mrs. Garvin appealed.

The 4th DCA gave an extended discussion of the requirement of good faith discovery and found that Mrs. Tidwell violated her discovery obligations by failing to disclose the Ex-Stress advertisement and information known to her about the horse's behavior which prompted the use of Ex-Stress.

The court stated "Since our system of justice depends on truthful discovery, misconduct in discovery must be discouraged by disallowing the settlement which is the fruit of such misconduct". One legal basis for the court's decision was a finding that the discovery violation created a unilateral mistake by Mrs. Garvin in her assessment of the case based upon the failure of Mrs. Tidwell to disclose the use of the supplement for Buster's behavior.

The *Garvin* case has numerous implications for attorneys and parties to confirm full compliance with all discovery requests, including proper answers to interrogatories, production of documents, and also truthful responses in deposition. Attorneys should counsel clients as to the impact that a discovery violation may have upon a mediated settlement agreement. As noted by the court, the requirement of good faith discovery is to enable parties to enter settlement negotiations with an understanding of their chances of success at trial.



PUBLIC NOTICE 2024 VALUE ADJUSTMENT BOARD APPLICANTS FOR SPECIAL MAGISTRATE

Opportunities now exist for appraisers and attorneys, who are licensed in the State of Florida and meet the following criteria to serve as Special Magistrate(S) to the 2024 Value Adjustment Board, pursuant to Florida Statute 194.035 and Chapter 12D, Florida Administrative Code, for the purpose of taking testimony and making recommendations with regard to:

- 1. The Special Magistrate must meet the following qualifications
 - a. A Special Magistrate must not be an elected or appointed official of the county.
 - b. A Special Magistrate must not be an elected or appointed official or employee of a taxing jurisdiction or of the State.
 - c. During a tax year in which a Special Magistrate serves, her or she must not represent any part before the board in any administrative review of property taxes.
 - d. All Special Magistrates must meet the qualifications specified in Section 194.035, F.S.
- 2. A Special Magistrate appointed to hear issues of exemption, classifications, and portability assessment difference transfers shall be a member of the Florida Bar, with no less than five years experience in the area of ad valorem taxation and having received training provided by the department, or with no less than three years of such experience and having completed training provided by the department.
- 3. A Special Magistrate appointed to hear issues regarding valuation of real estate shall be a state certified real estate appraiser with not less than five years experience in real property valuation and having received training provided by the department, or with no less than three years of such experience and having completed training provided by the department. A real property valuation Special Magistrate must be certified under *Chapter 475, Part II F.S.*
 - a. A Florida certified residential appraiser appointed by the Value Adjustment Board shall only hear petitions on the just valuation of residential real property of one to four residential units and shall not hear petitions on other types of real property.
 - b. A Florida certified general appraiser appointed by the Value Adjustment Board may hear petitions on the just valuation of any type of real property.
- 4. A Special Magistrate appointed to hear issues regarding valuation of tangible personal property shall be a designated member of a nationally recognized appraiser's organization with no less than five years experience in tangible personal property valuation and having received training provided by the department, or with no less than three years of such experience and having completed training provided by the department.
- 5. All Special Magistrates shall attend or receive an annual training program provided by the department. Special Magistrates substituting two years of experience must show they have completed the training by taking a written examination provided by the department. A Special Magistrate must receive or complete any required training prior to holding hearings.
- 6.
- a. The Value Adjustment Board or Board legal counsel must verify a Special Magistrate's qualifications before appointing the Special Magistrate.
- b. The selection of a Special Magistrate must be based solely on the experience and qualification of such magistrate, and must not be influenced by any party, or prospective party, to a board proceeding or by an such party with an in interest in the outcome of such proceeding. Special Magistrates must adhere to Rule 12D-9.022 F.AC., relating to disqualification or recusal.

Please note that hearings will take place October, November and December of 2024, and January and February of 2025. Availability for these dates is necessary for consideration of appointment.






