Bridging the Professions: YLD Plans Interdisciplinary Panel and Seeks Speaker Recommendations

The Young Lawyers Division (YLD) of the Manatee County Bar Association is pleased to announce

the development of a unique and engaging panel discussion aimed at strengthening connections between attorneys and the many non-lawyer professionals who contribute to the legal ecosystem in Manatee County. This event, which is currently in the planning stages, will bring together a variety of professionals who regularly interact with attorneys in the course of their work. Our goal is to foster a deeper understanding of how legal practice intersects with other fields—and to spotlight the diversity of career paths and practice areas available to today's young lawyers.

The YLD recognizes that legal practice does not exist in a vacuum. Attorneys collaborate daily with professionals across an incredible range of industries—law enforcement officers who provide vital input in criminal and civil investigations, therapists and counselors who guide clients through trauma in family law or dependency cases, real estate agents who facilitate property transactions, financial advisors who assist in probate and estate matters, local community leaders involved with infrastructure/development, and many more. These interdisciplinary relationships not only shape the way cases are handled but also influence how justice is administered in our community.

Through this panel, the YLD hopes to open a conversation between the legal profession and the broader community of professionals we rely on to do our work well. By inviting these individuals to share their perspectives, challenges, and experiences working with attorneys, we aim to better understand how we can collaborate more effectively and ethically. In doing so, we also hope to encourage more efficiency and innovation in the way legal services are delivered.

In addition to strengthening professional relationships, this event is part of the YLD's broader effort to expose young lawyers to the wide variety of legal career paths that exist both within and beyond traditional law firm settings. Too often, young attorneys enter the profession with a narrow view of what legal practice looks like. By hearing directly from professionals who interact with lawyers in different capacities, our members will gain insight into lesser-known or emerging areas of practice, identify new opportunities for professional development, and discover ways to add value across disciplines.

Whether it's learning how a social worker views the role of a dependency attorney, how a financial planner works with estate

lawyers, or how local government officials interact with land use attorneys, attendees will come away from the panel with a broadened perspective on what it means to be a lawyer today. We hope this event will inspire young attorneys to think creatively about their career paths and build relationships that enrich both their practice and their community involvement.

To ensure this event is as meaningful and representative as possible, the YLD is currently seeking nominations for panelists. We are looking for non-lawyer professionals who have direct, regular interactions with attorneys in Manatee County and who can speak thoughtfully about the nature of that collaboration. Panelists should be comfortable in a conversational setting, able to offer insights into their professional relationship with the legal field, and open to engaging in Q&A with an audience of legal professionals.

Ideal candidates may come from a range of professions, including: law enforcement (e.g., officers, investigators, victim advocates); mental health professionals (therapists, counselors, clinical social workers); court and judicial support staff (clerks, bailiffs, case managers); guardians ad litem or child welfare professionals; real estate professionals; accountants and financial advisors; forensic specialists or expert witnesses; non-profit organization leaders or community advocates; and local government employees.

If you have worked with someone whose perspective would benefit the broader bar—or if you know a professional who would bring energy and insight to the discussion—we invite you to submit their name for consideration. Please email your recommendations to cmanausa@grimesgalvano.com, and include a brief description of the nominee's role, experience, and relevance to this interdisciplinary discussion. **Recommendations are requested by July 15th,** and early submissions are encouraged.

Details regarding the date, location, and format of the panel will be announced soon. All members of the Manatee County Bar Association are encouraged to attend—especially those newer to the practice of law. We believe this panel will be both educational and inspiring, offering real-world insight into the value of professional collaboration and expanding our collective vision of what it means to serve clients and the community.

Int. US Attorney Gregory Kehoe Speaks at MCBA Law Day Luncheon

Just a few of the statements we heard from MCBA members who were fortunate enough to attend our 2025 Law Day Luncheon on May 21st. Int. US Attorney Gregory Kehoe presented "On the Trail of War Criminals: From Investigation to Prosecution" touching on his experience with war criminals from around the globe, including Saddam Hussein. Mr. Kehoe led the team of lawyers and investigators which advised the Iraqi Special Tribunal. Complete with photograph evidence, often heart wrenching, Int. US Attorney Kehoe described the scene, forensic investigative skills, and obstacles his team experienced during the investigation, culminating in the conviction of Saddam Hussein for crimes against humanity. Hussein was sentenced to death by hanging and was executed on December 30, 2006.

US Attorney Kehoe was appointed by Attorney General Pamela Bondi for the Middle District Court of Florida on March 31, 2025. Most recently, he was a shareholder at Greenberg Traurig.



DID YOU KNOW?

FL Bar Rule 5-1.1(g)(5)(B)

Determination of Interest Rates and Dividends

Effective May 15, 2023, an amendment to the Florida Bar Rule 5-1.1(g) established a floating minimum rate of interest tied to the Wall Street Journal Prime Rate, ensuring that IOTA accounts receive a fair return.

While banks are not obligated to offer IOTA accounts, those that choose to participate must comply with the interest rate calculation specified in Rule 5-1.1(g)(5)(B). Attorneys, in turn, must ensure that their IOTA accounts are held at financial institutions that meet these criteria.

By adhering to these guidelines, management of IOTA funds with a compliant bank partner ensures interest earned is remitted to the Florida Bar Foundation to fund legal aid services for low-income individuals.

Under the Florida Bar rule, the rate of interest earned in your IOTA account is currently calculated at 3.0%.





YOU CAN NOW RECEIVE CLE CREDIT FOR TAKING A PRO BONO CASE!

The Florida Supreme Court amended Rule 6-10.3 of the Rules Regulating the Florida Bar to allow Florida lawyers to earn one hour of general CLE credit for every hour of pro bono service, not to exceed five credit hours during a three-year reporting cycle.

Legal Aid of Manasota is happy to provide qualified cases to you. We always have a list of cases that are ready for pro bono placement. The clients have been vetted, and you will be covered under our malpractice insurance if you take a case through us. 
