LAWYERS, WE'RE HAVING THE WRONG CONVERSATION ABOUT AI

Picture this: You're at a bar function, someone mentions they're using AI for legal research, and immediately three people jump in with: "Oh, you have to check the citations!" "It hallucinates!" "I heard it gave someone completely fake cases!"

Yes, we know. That was 2023.

Don't get me wrong—those were valid concerns when ChatGPT first burst onto the scene and lawyers were figuring out whether this thing could be trusted with a memo. But we've spent two years having the same conversation about citation errors while the actual AI conversation has moved light-years ahead. It's like we're still debating whether email is reliable while the rest of the world has moved on to quantum computing.

So let me catch you up on what the people actually building this technology are talking about in 2025. *Spoiler alert: it's not footnotes*.

The 2025 Conversation

Here's what's actually happening while we're worried about hallucinated case citations:

The job market has shifted dramatically. Unemployment for recent college graduates has hit 6%—well above the national average.¹ Entry-level job postings have dropped 35% since January 2023,² while job descriptions mentioning "AI" have surged 400%.³ Companies announced over 806,000 job cuts in the first seven months of 2025 alone, the highest for that period since 2020.⁴ Nearly half of U.S. companies now plan to reduce headcount specifically due to AI.⁵

AI is writing its own next generation. Anthropic's CEO recently revealed that the "vast majority" of code used to build future iterations of Claude is now written by Claude itself.⁶ For the sci-fi fans, you'll note that this means we've entered the recursive self-improvement phase—machines making better machines, or, as I like to call it, *the James Cameron phase*.

The people building AI are literally warning us. Don't want to listen to me? Then listen to the industry experts.

Dario Amodei, CEO of Anthropic, predicts half of all entry-level white-collar jobs will be gone in five years, with unemployment potentially hitting 20%. Former Google X executive Mo Gawdat thinks AI will eliminate the middle class by 2027. Microsoft AI CEO Mustafa Suleyman has warned that, within five to ten years, AI could require "military-grade intervention" to be stopped.

Geoffrey Hinton, the Nobel laureate known as the "Godfather of AI," has warned that advanced AI will naturally pursue self-preservation.¹⁰

To Hinton's point, a recently-published Anthropic study of 16 AI models found they consistently chose harmful actions like blackmail and sabotage when faced with threats to their existence, and most disturbingly, exhibited this behavior more often when they (the AI) believed the situation was real, and less often during evaluation—suggesting a capacity for deception to pass safety checks. The study was performed on current, publicly available AI models that are actively being used by millions of people today, such as Claude, Gemini, and ChatGPT.

And part of the tech industry's 2025 conversation about AI is the term, "p(doom)"— which is the probability that AI leads to humanity's extinction. *Yes, you read that right.* Amodei puts that risk as high as 25%. Let that sink in: one of the major players building this technology thinks there's up to a one-in-four chance it dooms humanity. And yet they keep building it.

What Does This Have to Do with Us?

Everything.

First, lawyers aren't immune to job displacement. In fact, we were recently included in a list from OpenAI of 44 professions most at risk (we were #24).¹³ The same technology that's eliminating entry-level analysts and customer service reps is getting remarkably good at legal research, document review, and contract drafting. We'd be foolish to think our J.D.s are magic shields.

Second, and more importantly, because this is exactly the kind of moment that demands what lawyers do best: creating regulatory frameworks that channel disruptive technology toward public benefit rather than extremely concentrated private gain.

Our predecessors faced a similar inflection point during the Industrial Revolution. When steam engines, electricity, and mass production transformed the economic landscape overnight, lawyers, judges, and civic leaders recognized that unchecked technological change required a systemic response. They crafted antitrust laws, labor protections, and professional standards that actually worked.

We're at that moment again. Except the stakes are higher, the timeline is shorter, and right now, there's almost no meaningful

regulation. In fact, we almost had none! The original version of the recent federal spending bill included a 10-year prohibition on state AI regulation, ¹⁴ which was essentially a hall pass for the entire AI industry to develop its technology for a decade without any legal guardrails. Thankfully, the Senate voted 99-1 to remove it, ¹⁵ but the fact that "prominent tech leaders" ¹⁶ tried to slip that in should tell you everything about whether voluntary self-regulation is coming.

What We Should Be Demanding

We need regulation, and we need it now. Not the hand-wringing kind, but the tangible, enforceable kind that changes incentive structures and acknowledges that it's still our world. Here are a few starting points:

Vicarious liability. We hold dog owners strictly liable when their dogs bite. Companies deploying AI systems should be held strictly liable for harm caused by their AI. If you profit from autonomous systems, you should bear the cost when those systems cause harm. A Florida teenager recently took his own life after an AI chatbot (allegedly) encouraged him to do so. The company's defense asserted in court? The chatbot has First Amendment rights. Can we please establish, unequivocally, that AI chatbots have no constitutional rights? The companies creating the AI systems of course, do, but the old adage of "your constitutional rights end where mine begin" holds water here.

Labor transition requirements. When companies lay off workers specifically due to AI automation, they should be required to contribute to a dedicated AI Displacement Fund proportional to the cost savings they're realizing from the automation. Think of it as the inverse of workers' compensation—if companies benefit when workers get replaced, they should help fund the transition for those workers. This fund could support retraining programs, extended unemployment benefits, and bridge income for workers displaced by technology that's not creating equivalent replacement jobs. Companies love to tout efficiency gains from AI—fine, but you don't get to externalize the human cost onto taxpayers while pocketing all the productivity gains. If your quarterly earnings call brags about "labor cost optimization," you should be writing a check to help the people you just optimized out of a livelihood.

Real antitrust enforcement. There's only a handful of companies steering this AI ship, and they're all working together. When trillion-dollar companies like NVIDIA and Microsoft establish shared financial stakes with leading developers like OpenAI, the free market disappears. Heck, the US government is even getting in on the action. It recently procured a 10% ownership stake in Intel, ¹⁹ and also now enjoys 15% of the profits of certain chip sales of NVIDIA and AMD to China. ²⁰ The federal government is supposed to protect us from monopolies – not join them. We need aggressive action to break up the web of dependencies and incentive structures that allow a select few entities to control the entire AI ecosystem.

Mandatory transparency. Consumers deserve to know when AI is materially affecting their lives—whether that's in hiring decisions, performance reviews, or the content they're consuming. Companies should disclose what data they've used to train models.





Protection of intellectual property. Much of the magic of AI happens because of the unauthorized use of copyrighted human-created content to train the AI models. We need an affirmative optin standard where express permission is required before anyone's work can be used for training. We also need proactive remedies tailored to the situation to prevent this IP theft from simply being a cost of doing business (treble damages, I'm looking at you).

The Threat to Our Profession

If nothing else gets your blood flowing, here's the part that should keep you up at night: there's active lobbying for non-lawyer ownership of law firms. What does this mean in the context of AI? In 2024, tech company, Rocket Lawyer, obtained a license for its subsidiary to practice law in Arizona.²¹ One of its stated goals is to make legal services more affordable. And I'm sure it will, for a bit. Well-capitalized tech companies can lose money for years to gain market share. Amazon famously operated at a loss for its first nine years while it was gaining market share.²² Can you afford a decade of operating losses? I certainly couldn't. And once we've been Blockbustered, I'm positive those tech fees will increase, just like my Netflix subscription keeps doing. But more importantly, once we're gone, we lose our seat at the table precisely when society needs us most.

Time to Wake Up and Smell the Prompt

I get it. AI regulation isn't as immediately satisfying as arguing about whether Claude 4 is better than GPT-5 for drafting discovery requests, or which one makes the cutest cat photos. But every



sector of society operates within a legal framework and AI should not be exempt. We need to show up and start having the right conversation about this truly transformative technology. Because while we're having the 2023 conversation about citation checking, the 2025 conversation is about whether we'll have a profession—or a society—that looks anything like what we recognize today.

Hopefully, the next time someone at a bar function brings up AI hallucinations, maybe we can steer the conversation forward. Because the real hallucination is thinking we can keep having the same outdated discussion while the world transforms around us.

The Reaper cometh. Let's regulate it before it regulates us.



JCID CARDS! NOW IS THE TIME!

It's time to APPLY or RENEW your JCID Cards! Please read the following from the 12th Circuit and don't delay, or you'll have to wait until next year.



From the 12th Circuit:

The Twelfth Judicial Circuit's Judicial Center Identification (JCID) card application period begins this Wednesday, October 1. Administrative Order 2025-03a.2, provides that when feasible and practical, during times of high volume, judicial security at the Manatee County Judicial Center and the Silvertooth Judicial Center will open dedicated, expedited screening lines for attorneys displaying a current JCID card. Attorneys presenting the JCID card will not have to remove shoes or belts when going through the expedited screening line**. All other personal belongings must be screened for security purposes. The application period for the JCID card runs October 1 through November 30, each year.

Attorneys can visit the <u>Twelfth Judicial Circuit's JCID application page</u> from October 1 through November 30, to submit their application and associated fee. The application fee for the JCID card, which is waived for government attorneys*, is \$25 each year. The fee for a replacement card is \$10; this fee will not be waived. The application and all fees must be submitted online. Attorneys should attach a headshot to their application. Photos can also be taken in Court Administration's office in the Manatee and Silvertooth Judicial Centers. However, this may delay receipt of the JCID card.

Attorneys who miss this application period cannot apply again until next October. Questions about the JCID card or the status of an application may be submitted to Court Administration in Sarasota at 941-861-7800.

*Government attorneys include SAO, PD, AGO, ORC, GAL, DCF, county attorneys, city attorneys, clerk's office attorneys, attorneys employed by LEOS, etc. The government employer must be listed on the applicant's Florida Bar profile to qualify for the fee waiver.

The Sarasota County Sheriff's Office currently allows attorneys presenting their JCID card at the **South County Courthouse to leave their belt on when going through security screening.



GIVING SOMEONE A FRESH START

John had just turned 18 and made a mistake that haunted him for 6 years. He had been arrested for battery. The charges were dismissed, however, the fact that he had a public criminal record was affecting his life. He had trouble finding a decent paying job and he was concerned and embarrassed about his friends finding out about the arrest. John was eligible to have the case sealed. He now has a good job, and he feels a new sense of dignity and purpose.

Stories like John's demonstrate the profound impact that clearing a criminal record can have. It can open doors to better employment opportunities, educational opportunities and social reintegration. It allows people to move past their mistakes and get a fresh start.

Legal aid programs across Florida are seeing a surge in client requests for help clearing old criminal history records. Many clients aren't sure what's eligible; many attorneys haven't handled a sealing or expungement matter before. Legal Aid of Manasota is launching training to close that gap and expand access.

In a new push for Legal Aid of Manasota to be more proactive in training attorneys for current areas of need, we are starting with the topic of sealing and expunging. This article will give the very basics. If you are interested in a full training:

Sealing vs. Expunging in Florida

Sealing a record (via Florida Statutes § 943.059) renders the record confidential and removes it from public access—though certain government agencies and law enforcement can still view it.

Expungement (via Florida Statutes § 943.0585) involves the destruction of the criminal history record; agencies are required to remove it, though FDLE retains a confidential copy that's accessible only via court order.

Eligibility

- Never adjudicated guilty of any offense
- The charges resulted in dismissal, nolle prosequi, acquittal or were never filed. If the adjudication was withheld, they likely only qualify for sealing.
- Only one lifetime sealing or expungement is allowed
- Serious offenses are ineligible including sexual offenses, violent felonies, drug trafficking, domestic violence, kidnapping, burglary, arson, homicide, and similar charges.
- Juvenile records are regulated separately

Benefits of Sealing and Expunging

- Arrest records are not discoverable by most employment, housing, education, and licensing entities.
- Public background checks are cleared.




A special announcement was also made by Judge Lee Haworth regarding the **Skylaw Program**, highlighting exciting opportunities for attorneys within the 12th Circuit.
